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## **EXECUTIVE SUMMARY**

Ever cognizant to the URS vision to be the leading university in human resource development, technology and knowledge generation and environmental stewardship, the present leadership boldly implemented programs and projects for Fiscal Year 2018 that evidently manifest significant changes towards sustained development in instruction, research, extension and production services in the university system with the aim in view of total stakeholders satisfaction.

Foremost of the achievements of URS is the ISO 9001:2015 Certification issued by TUVRheinland. This is an affirmation that the Quality Management System (QMS) of the university is within the context of International Organization for Standardization (ISO). The university has also received various awards

namely: 2 Certificates of Recognition bestowed by PRIME-HRM of the Civil Service Commission for achieving Maturity Level 2 in the System, Selection and Placement as well in achieving Level 2 in the System Rewards and Recognition; Plaque of Recognition as one of the Outstanding Implementer of STARBOOKS given by the DOST IV-A; URS was a recipient of the Best Booth award during the 8<sup>th</sup> Tanay Hane Festival Agri-Trade Fair and Exhibit; one faculty was recognized as the Most Outstanding College Faculty and one Administrator was given the Most Outstanding College Head by Guronasyon Foundation; a faculty extensionist was adjudged as Best Speaker for presenting his paper in an international convention of extensionists; and a student from URS Angono won first place in the Best Photo Competition sponsored by STAARRDEC-PCAARRD.

URS is a prime mover in the implementation of the following special projects such as: Committee on Migration and Development (CMD), Regional Design and Creativity Hub for Innovations in MSMEs and Education (RDCHIME) and Sangguniang Kabataan Mandatory Training Program. These were all realized with the strong support of the Provincial Government of Rizal & Local Government Units for CMD, DOST RIV-A for RDCHIME and DILG for SK Training.

Anchored on the university's vision on environmental stewardship and as support to the YES program of the Provincial Government, URS has participated in different tree planting and caring activities, conducted series of advocacy campaigns, operationalized its Materials Recovery Facility, organized and implemented the yearly Annual Environment Week Celebration, and strictly implemented its Environmental Guidelines in the ten campuses. The university is an active partner of the Municipal Governments in the province in the implementation of environment related programs and activities.

URS Tanay Campus was adjudged no. 9 Best School to Study Agriculture for 2018 while URS Morong Campus was no. 28 Best Philippine School with Bachelor in Electronics Engineering Program for 2018. This is based on the data released by finduniversity.ph. Moreover, based on the information uploaded by localpulse.net, URS Morong ranked 30 among universities offering Engineering programs in the country. The University is continuously producing topnotchers in Licensure examinations: 5<sup>th</sup> place in the Licensure Examination for Agriculturists and 3<sup>rd</sup> place in Electronics Technician Licensure Examination.

Most of the academic programs in the undergraduate and graduate levels have been accredited by the Accrediting Agency for Chartered Colleges and Universities in the Philippines (AACCUP) and awarded with Certificate of Recognition by the Commission on Higher Education. Holistic development of students is conitnuously observed through active participation in culture and sports at the Regional Level as well as internationalization of student activity by joining in study tour program held abroad.

Faculty researchers had successfully completed twenty seven (27) research studies purposely to address identified gaps in various disciplines and needs of the community. Major outputs of four (4) research studies were published in ISI/CHED recognized refereed journals while significant findings of ten (10) research papers were disseminated through paper presentation in various international, national and regional fora.

Towards helping the community to effect transformations on the lives among residents, faculty extensionists had implemented eighteen (18) extension projects in different municipalities with the strong support of partner organizations within the community. Experiences and results of five (5) extension projects

were also shared to various sectors through paper presentation in various conventions/conferences at the national and regional levels.

As part of its image building effort, the university actively participated in national, regional and local different trade fairs. This is an avenue to showcase various products and services of the university as a result of its research and development initiatives.

URS forged engagement with other agencies for the implementation of notable projects which have bearing on the upliftment of the university's programs and services. A Memorandum of Understanding with National Taipei University (NTPU) for the conduct of student faculty exchange, memorandum of agreement with DWDD-Katropa Radio (AM radio station) for advocacy, promotion and public affairs, and memorandum of understanding with Bangko Sentral ng Pilipinas for the provision of on-line publications, books and other instructional materials. The Nutrition Research Information Network (NUTRINET) donated books and other instructional materials for library use.

The intellectual property of faculty researchers/innovators/writers borne out of their research projects and scholarly works is strictly protected through copyright, patent and ISBN registration.

Furthermore, to ensure better delivery of services in the different campuses, upgrading of facilities through the construction of new buildings and repair of existing ones were initiated. New equipment and supplies were purchased to ensure better efficiency and effectiveness in the implementation of various activities related to instruction, research and production. While manpower requirement was also beefed-up by hiring new faculty and staff or promoting those deserving personnel to higher positions. Exemplary performances of the faculty, staff and service units of the university are duly recognized during the annual Programs on Awards and Incentives Service Excellence (PRAISE) awarding rites.

The hardwork, commitment, dedication and contribution of every URS Giant are humbly recognized because they served as an engine to propel continuous growth and development of our beloved university.





As of December 2018, 90% of the graduate programs of URS across campuses were accredited by the Accrediting Agency of Chartered Colleges and Uuniversities in the Philippines (AACCUP). 57% (12 programs) of which are Level I, and 33% (7 programs) are Level II.

On the other hand, 87% of the baccalaureate programs were also accredited. 43% (29 programs) of which are Level I, 35% (24 programs) are Level II, and 16% (11 programs) are Level III.




