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## ○ EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

This Annual Accomplishment Report was prepared by the Office of the President-University Planning, Monitoring, and Evaluation Office (UPMEO) in coordination with all its divisions, offices, units and centers to communicate to its stakeholders all the achievements of the university for the year 2020.

This report was arranged in accordance to the strategic importance of these achievements and/or according to their relevance to the call of the times. Hence, this report starts with a technical presentation patterned after the Physical Report of Accomplishments submitted annually to the Department of Budget and Management with focus on percentage of first-time licensure exam passers on first take, employability of graduates, percentage of undergraduate enrolment in RDC-identified priority programs and percentage of undergraduate programs with accreditation. It was followed by percentage of graduate school faculty pursuing advanced degree programs, percentage of faculty actively pursuing research, producing technologies, and these researches have resulted to an extension program. The percentage of graduate students enrolled in research degree programs and accredited graduate programs were also presented in this report.

The number of research outputs of faculty was also indicated in this report together with the number of completed researches and the percentage of these researches published in international refereed journal. Lastly, the technical report also includes the number of active partnerships the university has including the number of trainees weighted by the length of training, number of extension programs organized and supported and percentage of beneficiaries who rate the training course as Satisfactory or better.

Some research and extension programs were highlighted due to their compelling contents or relevance to the time especially explaining in details how these programs help the community transition to the new normal. This report has dedicated special spread for the various university-initiated COVID-19 projects and activities that significantly helped its populace as well as its clients mitigate the impact of the pandemic.

Highlighted in this report were the various winnings of our students in regional and national competitions and the student development services delivered despite the limitations and restrictions. Faculty members were likewise given continuous professional development programs most especially on how to effectively handle online and flexible learning modalities. The university through the University of the Philippines Open University (UPOU) was able to adapt to the challenging times with respect to how it would deliver quality education despite the restrictions and limitations. The faculty members were able to develop modules which were used by the students in the first semester. These modules were specially designed to accommodate blended or flexible learning.

Institutional trainings given to the teaching and non-teaching staff were also presented in this report to touch on the importance of having everyone onboard on this new modality of public service. The list of newly promoted faculty members and non-teaching staff was also presented as well as facilities and physical improvements implemented or constructed for the year.

The university's accreditation to the ISO 9001:2015 was highlighted as well as the institutional conduct of the PRAISE Awards. The various projects approved and/or recommended for final approval were provided on a latter part of this report while the proposed URS Strategic Plan 2021-2031 was likewise presented for the appreciation of the university stakeholders.

The following accomplishments are summarized and clustered into four (4) Major Final Outputs (MFOs) consistent to the format of the Physical Report of Operation (PRO). This PRO is a Budget Accountability Report (BAR) that reflects the university's actual physical accomplishments for the year 2020 in terms of performance measures as indicated in its Physical Plan.

### ○ LICENSURE

This Outcome Indicator focuses on the university's accomplishments in the areas of performance in licensure examinations for first-time takers within the year.

The URS has posted 33.33% passers for the Master Plumber examinations. This is lower than the 2020 target of 54% as most if not all of the scheduled licensure examinations were put on hold or were postponed to an indefinite time due to the on-going global COVID-19 pandemic.

The URS was also recognized as one of the TOP engineering schools in the country for its consistent performance in various engineering licensure examinations for the many years now. engineersnow.com, an online resource that lists and tabulates overall performance of schools in the country cited URS Antipolo campus as Top 10 Best Electronics Engineering School in the Philippines while URS Morong campus was recognized as Top 29 Best in the country as well. These citations have solidified the position of the university as a top caliber engineering school in not only in CALABARZON but also in the Philippines being at par with other well-known institutions offering the same programs.

### ○ EMPLOYABILITY

This Outcome Indicator presents the ability of the URS graduates to find jobs related to their degree program within two (2) years after graduating from the university.

Per the consolidated data from the office of the OJT and Placement of the OSDS, the university has an aggregate employability of 25% for its graduates for the last 2 years. This is higher than the 22% target for 2020. The university is now streamlining its monitoring processes in order to broaden the scope and have real time employability data of its graduates through the use of ICT tools.

### **O PURSUING PHD/DBA/DIT ETC.**

This Outcome Indicator presents the percentage of graduate school faculty who are pursuing advanced research degree program.

The university has posted 40.54% of its graduate school faculty enrolled in advanced research degree program. This is higher than the 38% target for the year on this particular indicator.

### **O PURSUING RESEARCH IN THE LAST 3 YEARS**

This Outcome Indicator presents the percentage of graduate school faculty who are actively pursuing research activities in the last three (3) years.

The university has posted 49.61% of its graduate school faculty who are actively pursuing research studies in the last three (3) years. This is higher than the 47% target for the year with respect to this indicator.

### **O PRODUCING TECHNOLOGIES FOR COMMERCIALIZATION OR LIVELIHOOD IMPROVEMENT**

This Outcome Indicator presents the percentage of graduate school faculty who are engaged in research work and such research work produced technologies for commercialization or livelihood improvement in a given community.

The university has posted only 4.27% as against its target of 31% for the year. This is mainly due to the limited movement and restrictions on public engagements as enforced by the Inter-Agency Task Force (IATF) for COVID-19. Such restrictions have inadvertently affected the commercialization of various researches done by the faculty prior to 2020.

### **O RESEARCH RESULTED TO EXTENSION**

This Outcome Indicator presents the percentage of graduate school faculty whose research works have been translated into an extension program.

The university has posted 17.95% of its graduate school faculty whose research works have resulted to extension programs which greatly benefited the community and the society at large. This figure is higher than the 13% target on the number of extension programs to be implemented in 2020.

## **O PERCENTAGE OF GRADUATE STUDENTS ENROLLED IN RESEARCH DEGREE PROGRAMS**

This Output Indicator presents the percentage of graduate students enrolled in programs with thesis/dissertation requirements.

The university registered 94.12% of its graduate degree programs that require thesis/dissertation in order for students to graduate in their respective programs. This is higher than the 40% target slated for the year.

## **O PERCENTAGE OF ACCREDITED GRADUATE PROGRAMS**

This Output Indicator presents the percentage of graduate programs offered by the university duly accredited by the Accrediting Agency of Chartered Colleges and Universities in the Philippines (AACCUP).

The university was able to accredit 90.48% of all its programs in the graduate school. This is lower than .52% of the 91% target for the year. However, the remaining graduate school programs that are not yet accredited have already been applied for accreditation to AACCUP in 2021.

## **O RESEARCH OUTPUTS IN THE LAST 3 YEARS UTILIZED BY THE INDUSTRY OR BY OTHER BENEFACTORS**

This Outcome Indicator presents the number of research outputs done by the faculty members in the last 3 years which are utilized by the industry or by other benefactors.

This Outcome Indicator presents the number of active partnerships between the university and various Local Government Units (LGUs), industry associations, Non-Government Organizations (NGOs), Small and Medium Enterprises and other stakeholders and interest groups as a result of extension activities.

The university was able to engage and partner with 20 organizations last year. This is higher than the 13 organizations targeted for partnership and is set to increase in the coming years.

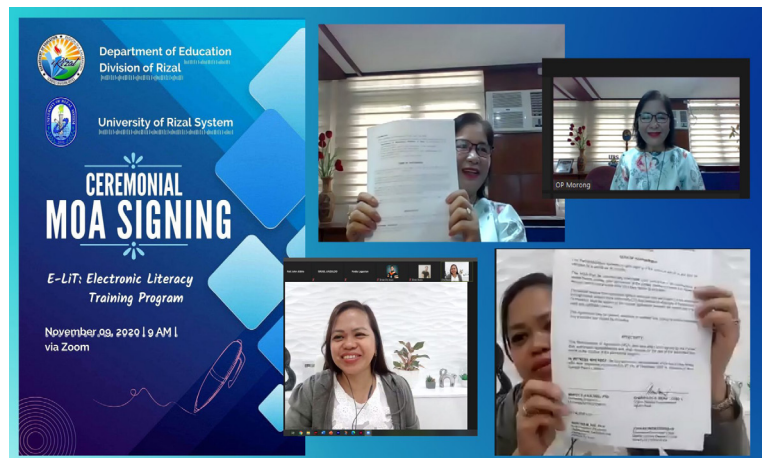

## EXTENSION PROGRAMS

### ELIT TRAINING PROGRAM

The College of Computer Studies of URS Blnangonan has conceptualized and implemented an extension program entitled “ELiT: Electronic Literacy Training Program (Capacity Building for other partner institutions/agencies in Rizal)”. The proponents include Prof. Alking P. Sunga, Prof. Joyce Lyn M. Abaoag, Prof. Marthea Andrea O. Daluyon, Prof. Joy SG. Cruz, Prof. Jayson O. Daluyon, Prof. Neil John P. Albito and Prof. Ernan P. de Jesus. The first project under this program is entitled “G Suites Collaboration: Empowering DepEd Non-Teaching Personnel.” The project aims to provide free trainings to the Department of Education (DEPED)- Division of Rizal, Non-Teaching Staff to be utilized in their administrative tasks.



Specifically, the training program, specifically aims to enable the 2000 participants from 13 sub-offices of Department of Education (DEPED) - Division of Rizal with seminars and trainings in different Video Conference Platforms and G Suite tools that can be used for collaborative administrative work; ensure 90% practical and hands on involvement on the technical aspect of different online platforms, G Suite tools and spreadsheet; and 100% of the target participants have improved their level of competency on using different online platforms, G Suite tools and spreadsheet in collaborative administrative and office works.

Initial works including signing of the Memorandum of Agreement between the university and the Department of Education-Rizal were done and trainings have started last January 2021.



### BARO (Business Assistance for Repatriated Overseas Filipino Workers) Extension Program

To help the Overseas Filipino Workers (OFWS) who were repatriated due to the ongoing global COVID-19 pandemic, the University of Rizal System through the initiative of the Office of Public Affairs headed by Dr. Reneecilia Paz de Leon has conceptualized an intervention program which was translated into a full-blown extension program named BARO or Business Assistance for Repatriated Overseas Filipino Workers. The Extension Program Leader is Dr. Joanne S. Concepcion (Dean, College of Business) while Prof. Jeffrey M. Azor serves as the Assistant Program Leader. Dr. Nancy T. Pascual, University President, and Dr. Reneecilia B. Paz de Leon served as Program Coordinators. Dr. Marites M. Rio, Vice President of RDEP and Dr. Fe

Esperanza T. Mateo, Director for Extension served as Consultants. For Phase 1, the Project Leader is Prof. Myra M. Salindong and for Phase 2, the Project Leader is Prof. Grenelita B. Felipe. Members of the BARO Extension Program are Mr. Sam Cedrick H. Calites, Prof. Rosechel R. Corral, Mr. Ernan de Jesus, Prof. Nora D. Ramos, Dr. Eden C. Santos (OIC Campus Director, URSB), Prof. Ernie D. Tano (Dean, College of Accountancy), and Prof. Jonas D. Ynares. Prof. Arminda Campo and Mr. Kevin Aquino provided Technical Support to the program.

This extension program is in partnership with the National Economic Development Authority (NEDA)-Committee on Migration and Development (CMD), ATIKHA Overseas Workers and Communities Initiative, Inc., Philippine National Volunteer Service Coordinating Agency (PNVSCA) for Balikabayanhan Campaign and Overseas Workers Welfare Administration (OWWA), and the university. The project aims to provide practical and easily implementable business development services that could curve the macroeconomic impact of lower remittance rates due to the influx of repatriated OFWs and reinvigorate their sense of dignity to rise above this crisis and establish their own business. Finally, this project wanted to push for a more vibrant and dynamic flow of production resources that could help revive the already plummeting Philippine economy.



Through this program, the university was able to conduct Phase 1 and Phase 2 of the program. During the Phase 1 of the program implementation, the team was able to conduct webinars on Self Mastery with Values Formation, Success Stories of OFWs, Business Readiness Assessment and Business Opportunities. For the Module Development (Phase 2), the team conducted a webshop in the various functional areas of business plans including Personnel/Organizational Plan, Marketing Plan, Technical/Production Plan, Finance and Accounting with Legal Aspect and Socio-economic Plan.

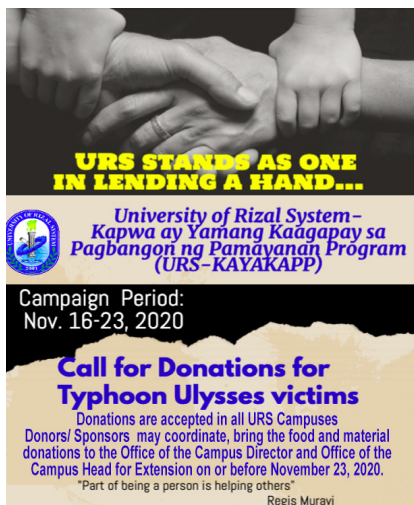
There were around 500 attendees to these webinars coming from the various regions of the country, some from Middle East and even South America (for OFWs who are waiting to be repatriated).

Those who are eager to really push through their dream business have already prepared their business plans. The team members are currently improving these business plans and coaching these repatriated OFWs for them to be qualified for business loans or other grants provided by the government or other financial institutions.

The extension program will provide consultancy work to these repatriated OFWs until they set up their business, register it and operate it for the next 6 months FREE of charge true to the commitment of URS to be of service to the nation especially in these tough times.



## PROJECT KAYAKKAP



The URS in its sincere regards to its people and community most especially in the devastating aftermath of typhoon Ulysses has spearheaded an extension project dubbed as URS KAYAKAPP. This project KAYAKAPP stands for Kapwa Ay YAmang KAagapay sa Pagbangon ng Pamayanan. This Bayanihan Project was able to raise funds, foods, canned goods, bottled water, blankets, and clothes which were then subsequently distributed to approximately 1,000 families in the upland communities of Tanay, Rodriguez and San Mateo, Rizal.

The University Extension Services Unit under Dr. Fe Esperanza T. Mateo championed the project in close coordination with the Campus Directors and Campus Heads for Extension. URS KAYAKAPP became successful due to the overwhelming support from the URS administrators, faculty, non-teaching personnel, students

plus the very support that was given by the URS Alumni Affairs, Alumni Associations and friends of the University. The campaign for support ran from November 16-23, 2020 and the distribution of these assistance happened between December 1-16, 2020.

## SATISFACTION RATING OF EXTENSION BENEFICIARIES

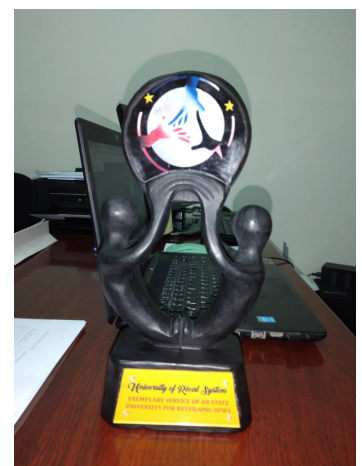
This Output Indicator presents the percentage of beneficiaries who provided a Satisfactory or higher rating in terms of quality and relevance of training provided by the university.

The university got 100% satisfaction rating from the beneficiaries of various extension trainings spearheaded by the faculty-extensionists for the year 2020. It is higher than the target rating of 87% originally set for trainings.

## INSTITUTIONAL AWARDS

### ATIKHA recognition for URS

The University of Rizal System was recognized in the BaliKabayanihan 2020 Awards last December 18, 2020 under the auspices of the National Economic Development Authority (NEDA)-Committee on Migration and Development (CMD). It is one of the prestigious awards given to any individual or institution who have provided exemplary services and genuine concern to the casue and welfare of our new breed of heroes, our OFWs. Through the implementation of the URS-led and initiated extension program dubbed as Business Assistance for Repatriated Overseas Filipino Workers or BARO Program, the university was recognized as a very important partner of not just NEDA-CMD but also with other attached agencies nsuch as OW/WA, ATIKHA and BALIKA-BAYANIHAN. To date, the extension program was able to train around 500 repatriated OFWs and their families and helped them develop



their own business plans and establish their own business in the process. The program also offers FREE coaching and mentoring sessions to those who were able to put up their business for at least six months until they can confidently operate on their own. This program was hailed as one of the best practices in this context and was considered a benchmark by which other partnerships will be measured upon. The University President, Dr. Nancy T. Pascual, received the award on behalf of the program team and the whole university.

## SPECIAL COVID INITIATIVES

URS Cares as a COVID donation drive initiative by the administration, faculty and alumni for the employees and students of URS and community members who are heavily hit by the COVID-19 pandemic.

Through this initiative and the overwhelming response of the whole URS community and respective stakeholders like the alumni, all municipalities in the province of Rizal were provided with several relief packs and complementary services. Angono got to be served for 23 times, Antipolo City was served 19 times while Baras, Binangonan, Cainta, Cardona, Jalajala and Morong were served for 8, 29, 8, 10, 1 and 16 times. The municipalities of Pililla, Rodriguez, San Mateo, Tanay, Taytay and Teresa were served for 8, 13, 1, 105, 7 and 2 times during the project implementation.

There were a total of 29,018 beneficiaries of this initiative with breakdown as follows: 578 URS employees, 2,704 front liners, 304 students, 16,609 community residents and 8,823 families all over the province.

With respect to the nature of services and assistance provided through this initiative, 43% were in the form of relief goods, 28% in the form of food packs and beverages, 17% in cash assistance, 6% in the form of Personal Protective Equipment (PPEs), 4% Online Counselling and 2% in the form of Personal Hygiene Kits.

The #ONEURS Against COVID-19 project was able to strive a substantial amount of goods for 88 URS security guards, 86 Emergency Laborers and 4 SPR employees. Four (4) referring hospitals connected to the university were given 50 pcs of surgical masks, 15 pcs face shields, and 10 pcs Personal Protective Equipment (PPE). Financial assistance was also provided to support the Hospital Bills of one of agency guard as well as grocery items for the family of one organic guard who had undergone home quarantine.

Through the International Development and Special Programs, URS provided food assistance to foreign students that are stranded due to intensive community lockdown. Foreign students were also assisted in their health and travel clearance needs specifically through the frontliners of URS Morong and Binangonan campus.

Various alumni association such as the URS Morong College Alumni Association (URSMCAA) and the URSB Alumni Association have provided various goods and services to the marginalized people in the whole province of Rizal.

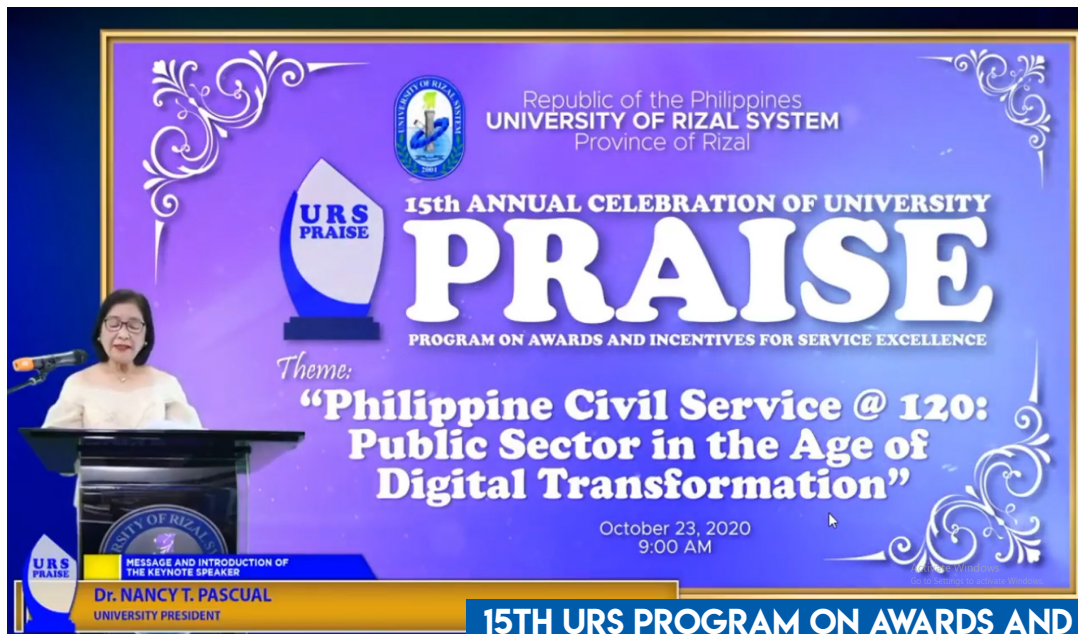


## URS ISO CERTIFICATION

## GOVERNMENT FUNDED PROJECTS

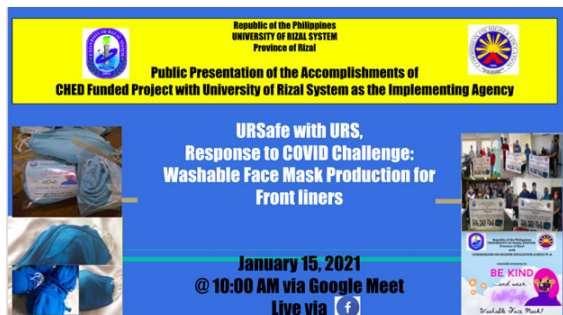

## CHED FUNDED PROJECTS

1. URSafe with URS, Response to Covid-19 Challenge: Washable Face Mask Production for Front-liners



The Commission on Higher Education (CHED) Memorandum Order No. 1, s. of 2020 otherwise known as the Guidelines for the Grant of Assistance to State Universities and Colleges to Combat COVID-19 authorizes state universities and colleges to conduct research and extension services, including projects that will improve and intensify the government's existing COVID-19 responses. With this, CHED have granted the University of Rizal System a total of four hundred eighty thousand

six hundred five pesos (Php 480,605.00) for the production of face masks for the front liners. The project was able to distribute a total of ten thousand three hundred (10,300) pieces of face masks to the different municipalities in the Province of Rizal. Project proponents are Dr. Reneecilia Paz De Leon, Prof. Bernadette Castalone, and Prof. Jameson Martinez.

2. Project POST: Production of Soap to Combat Covid 19

The Commission on Higher Education (CHED) Memorandum Order No. 1, s. of 2020 otherwise known as the Guidelines for the Grant of Assistance to State Universities and Colleges to Combat COVID-19 authorizes state universities and colleges to conduct research and extension services, including projects that will improve and intensify the government's existing COVID-19 responses. With this, CHED have granted the University of Rizal System a total of seven hundred seventy seven thousand four hundred fifty eight and 15/100 pesos (Php 777,458.15) for the production of antibacterial bar soaps for the target beneficiaries identified such as the local government unit front liners, the Philippine National Police (PNP), military personnel, hospital crews and the municipalities in the Province of Rizal.

The project was able to distribute a total of forty thousand (40,000) pieces of soaps spearheaded by the project proponents Prof. Ma. Cristina Payofelin, Prof. Eugene Tia, with their project members Mr. Ricky Ulep, Mr. Ronald Pantaleon, Ms. Loreta Cornejo and Mr. Darwin Vidanes.



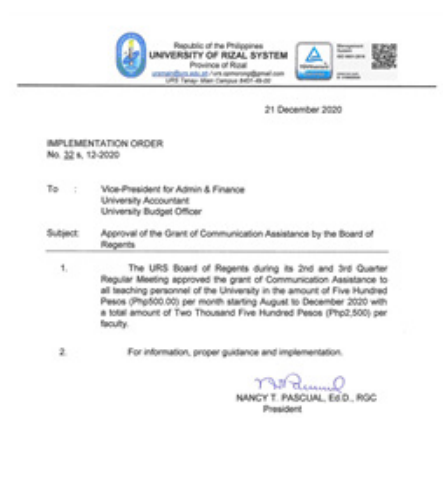
## BENEFITS GRANTED BY THE UNIVERSITY

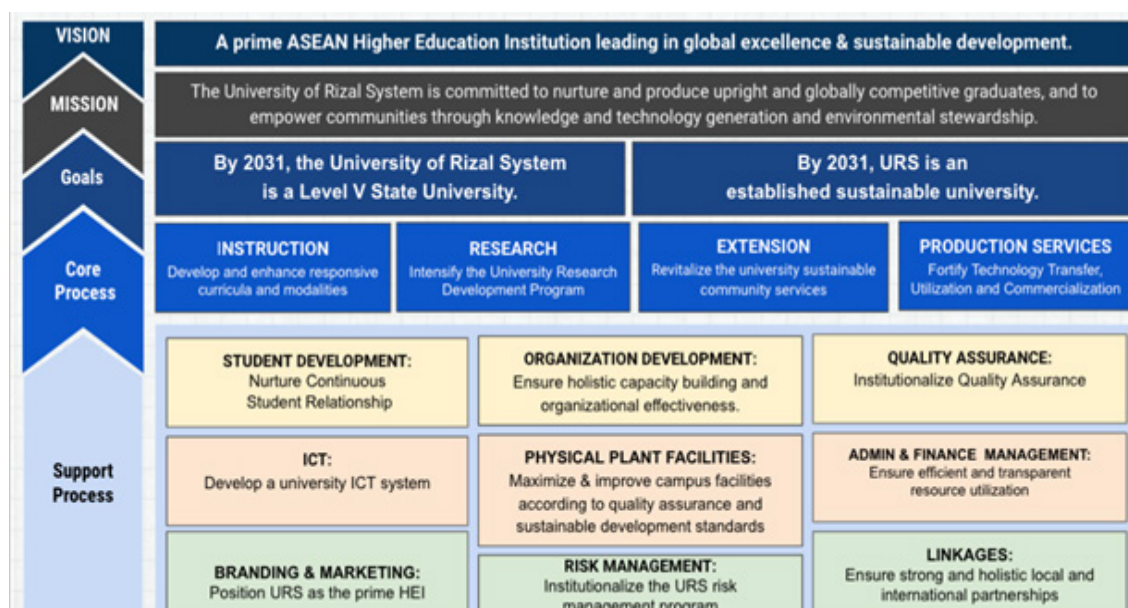
