2 Alumni Topnotch, Board Passers Noted

To strengthen the presence of the University to the local community, URS has entered into different partnerships with various local government units as well as different private enterprises to enhance the involvement of the University to various local development projects as well as improving student career opportunities.

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URS Campuses Undergo AACCUP Accreditation; ISO Recertification Granted

hree campuses of the University underwent Level II accreditation survey visit by the Accrediting Agency of Chartered Colleges and Universities in the Philippines, Inc. (AACCUP) on May 2-6. Likewise, URS had undergone the International Organization for Standardization (ISO) 9001:2015 recertification on May 5 -6.

Two undergraduate courses -Bachelor of Science (BS) in Information Technology (BSIT) and BS in Office Administration (BSOA) - of URS - Binangonan, the BS in Fisheries of URS - Cardona; and the BS in Office Administration, Master in Public Administration, and Doctor in Public Administration of URS -Pililla underwent online accreditation.

Dr. Divinagracia De Guzman of Nueva Vizcaya State University (NVSU) served as overall coordinator for the Binangonan and Cardona campuses. 

34th Acad Meet Approves Graduates, Awardees

The University of Rizal System held its 34th Academic Council Meeting 8:30 am via Zoom video conference on May 11.



The agenda of the meeting included the approval of the candidates of graduation as well as the honors and awards to be granted for school year 2021-2022. The breakdown of the approved candidates for graduation follows: Angono Campus – 337, Antipolo – 460, Binangonan – 847, Cainta – 137, Cardona – 52, Morong – 1,062, Pililla – 253, Rodriguez – 397, Tanay – 335 and Taytay – 91. This brings a total of 3,971 graduates for this school year.

Furthermore, the honors and awards to be given total to 515 across all campuses. Details are as follows: academic excellence awards – 98, special awards – 219, graduate school academic excellence awards – 4, senior high school academic excellence awards – 144, and laboratory school academic excellence awards – 50.

URS Gets COPC Compliance

The Commission on Higher Education (CHED) approved on February 13, 2018 the inclusion of 78 local universities and colleges (LUCs), which have undergone institutional and program evaluation by CHED since 2017, to be eligible to accept students who will avail of free tuition and other school fees under the Universal Access to Quality Tertiary Education Act or RA 10931 starting Academic Year 2018-2019.

These LUCs are given 2 years to comply with all other institutional and program requirements in order to be part of RA 10931 and failure to do so will result in their exclusion from the list of LUCs to avail benefits under RA 10931.

Furthermore, on June 18, 2018, the Commission approved the provision of financial assistance for capacity building of LUCs towards obtaining Certificate of Program Compliance (COPC) as a requirement for continuous availment under RA 10931.

The Certificate of Program Compliance (COPC) is a recognition that the specific degree programs being offered by SUCs/LUCs are fully compliant with the policies, standards and guidelines of CHED. To ensure that the existing programs of the SUCs/LUCs are quality assured, the issuance of COPC is being requested from CHED.

Four undergraduate courses in URS, namely, BS in Music Education, BS in Hospitality Management, BS in Tourism and BS in Computer Engineering are already COPC certified. Other 48 undergraduate courses are undergoing the same process of application. //
