T he University of Rizal System (URS) celebrated its President's Convocation at the Eulogio "Amang" Rodriguez Tanghalang Sining (EARTS) on February 24.

In his opening remarks, Dr. Marvin Amoin, Vice President for Administration and Finance, expressed his gratitude to the faculty and staff for their continuous support and guidance, highlighting the milestones achieved by the University while looking to the future ahead.

During his message, Dr. Allan Conde, Vice President for Academic Affairs, emphasized the importance of teamwork and coming together.

Dr. Nancy Pascual, University President, thanked the three vice presidents, campus directors, the Supreme Student University Government, faculty and staff, and her family for their constant and unwavering support.

The recognition and in-person oath-taking of the 73 newly hired and promoted faculty and staff in the different available plantilla positions of the University followed.

The President's Report highlighted the journey and achievements of the University under the President's leadership, which set the tone for the academic year ahead, emphasizing the importance of academic excellence, diversity, and inclusivity through its 67M+ external grants; 100% AACCUP accredited baccalaureate and graduate programs; passing rate in board examinations in civil engineering, mechanical engineering, master electrician, and agriculture and biosystems engineering; licensure examinations topnotchers professional teachers, electronics technician, and fisheries professional; ISO 9001:2015 certification for five years in a row; PRIME-HRM maturity level 2 by CSC; and a high ranking educational institutions higher according to EduRank.

Additionally, the President also stated the various achievements under the Academic Affairs division, such as the new academic programs



developed, enrolment and graduation trend, accredited programs for the period 2020-2023, and the new academic policies and guidelines proposed and approved by the Board of Regents. Following are the Research Development, Extension, Production division's accomplishments such as the revision of the research operations manual; University research agenda; extension operations manual; presentation of completed researches, research publications, and the total engagement in extension and research throughout the ten different campuses; holding of national and international research and extension conferences; registration and filing of intellectual properties; and the setting of University extension thrusts and Lastly, priorities. under Administration and Finance division, the President emphasized the University's involvement in community outreach development, Bayanihan project training conducted, infrastructure projects, grants and subsidies from other government agencies, and budget utilization rate, the construction of the University Health and Wellness Center, MODEL University Resilient and SMART Building, and the dormitory and

business centers in Antipolo City, Morong, and Tanay Campuses. The URS Development Goals, the plans from Year 1 to Year 4 under her leadership in terms of administration, faculty and staff, curricular programs, and students were also cited.

Tia Invents Mosquito Attractant from Plant Extract

Prof. Eugene Tia, Head of Food Analytical and Research Services Laboratory, URS, with the support of the URS Intellectual Property Office (IPO), was granted the Letters Patent Invention by the IPO Office of the Philippines — Bureau of Patents for the Invention titled "Process of Producing Mosquito Attractant with Plant Extract and the Product Thereof".

The said patent grants the holder the right to restrain and prohibit any unauthorized person or entity from making, using, offering for sale, selling, or importing the product and importing any product obtained directly or indirectly from such process.

This exclusivity serves as a strong motivator to devote skills to innovative projects in addition to acting as a safeguard for the products of intellectual effort while acting as a powerful incentive for investing time, resources, and expertise into ground-breaking endeavors. ~ JFa

Padilla, Studes Register Utility Model

Prof. Earth Padilla of URS Morong Campus together with Jemmygrace Espiritu Santo, Wynona Beatriz San Juan, Julie Dianne Arroyo, Rejinah Fe Del Rey, and Cristine Antonete Pantaleon, University of Rizal System (URS) Laboratory Schools students, with the support of the URS Intellectual Property Office (IPO) applied for the registration of technologies under Utility Model titled "A Process of Making Textile Fiber from Fish Scales" and "Composition of Textile Fiber Derived from Fish Scales and Hot-Melt Adhesives" at the Bureau of Patents, IPO Office of the Philippines, Taguig City.

Having been accepted for registration, the IPO grants and/or assigns the grantees the exclusive right throughout the Philippines to make use, sell, or import the utility model, for a term of seven years from the date of filing. ~JFa
