The essential orientation sessions, led by key university officials, were held from July 28-29 and 31 reaching various departments.

The initiative aimed to equip faculty and staff with the necessary knowledge and tools to meticulously prepare their respective financial and project plans, ensuring alignment with the University's overall goals and compliance with established guidelines.

The preparation program kicked off on July 28, with sessions for Academic Affairs (AA) and Research Development, Extension, and Production (RDEP) held concurrently at the AVEC, URS, and the session for the Office of the President (OP), conducted virtually via Google Meet, along with the Administration and Finance division on July 31.
