

Strong Performance Shown in MELE, MPLE Exams; URS Hailed Top Performing in CHRA Test, Records MPLE Topnotcher

The University of Rizal System (URS) has demonstrated commendable results in the recent licensure examinations for Mechanical Engineers, Certified Human Resource Associates (CHRAs), and the Master Plumbers' licensure test, highlighting the institution's commitment to producing competent professionals.



In the Mechanical Engineer licensure examinations held in February, the URS-Morong campus showcased a solid performance with 36 out of 49 examinees successfully passing. This translates to a passing rate of 42.35%, indicating the quality of engineering education provided at the Morong campus. Likewise, URS takes pride in its 14 graduates who passed the Master Plumbers' licensure examinations, with one graduate making it to the Top 7 rank.

The URS-Morong campus further distinguished itself in the March 2025 Certified Human Resource Associate (CHRA) examinations. All four examinees from URS-Morong passed the CHRA exams, achieving a perfect 100% passing rate. This outstanding result positions URS-Morong as one of the top-performing schools in the country for this particular licensure exam.

Beyond the impressive results from the Morong campus, other URS campuses also contributed to the overall success in the CHRA examinations. URS-Binangonan produced 3 successful passers, while URS-Tanay and URS-Rodriguez had 2 and 1 passers, respectively. These results across different URS campuses underscore the university's broader impact in producing qualified human resource professionals across the Rizal province.

Ten other CHRA passers across URS campuses were also recorded in February of this year.~

R4 Women's Month Tackles Gender Equality, Inclusivity



Local Innovations Registered as Utility Models by IPOPHIL

The Intellectual Property Office of the Philippines (IPOPHL) has officially recognized two significant local technological developments by granting them Utility Model registration. This form of intellectual property protection is awarded to technical solutions that are new and industrially applicable, offering a more accessible route for innovation compared to patents.

One of the registered technologies, titled "A Device for Attracting and Eliminating Mosquitoes," was developed by a team of dedicated individuals: Myrrah Kay Rioveros, Ronette Abarico, Eunica Borac, Novelle Aldam Villaluz, and their mentor, Prof. Eugene Tia. The registration was finalized on December 9, 2024. This innovative device aims to provide a solution for mosquito control, potentially contributing to the prevention of mosquitoborne diseases prevalent in the region. The utility model registration grants the developers the exclusive right to prevent others from commercially using their device without authorization for a period of seven years from the date of filing.

Likewise, IPOPHIL also granted a Utility Model registration on January 24, 2025, to Dr. Leo Rio and



Dr. Marites Rio for their technology, "Hard Hat with Face Shield and Air Curtain." This invention presents an advancement in personal protective equipment, designed to enhance the safety of workers in various industries. The integration of a face shield with an air curtain suggests a mechanism to protect the wearer not only from physical impact but also from airborne particles and contaminants, potentially improving workplace health and safety. $\sim abc$

of Secondary Education majors in English, Filipino, Mathematics, and Social Studies, and Bachelor in Elementary Education.
