Remarkable Success in Licensure Exams Noted

URS is buzzing with pride and congratulations as a significant number of its graduates achieved remarkable success in various licensure examinations held in early 2025. The University has once again proven its commitment to academic excellence and producing highly competent professionals, even earning the distinction of being a top-performing school in a recent assessment.

URS-Morong saw a strong showing in the April 2025 Electrical Engineering Licensure Examination, with 15 passers adding their names to the roster of licensed electrical engineers. Complementing this achievement, the campus also celebrated Engr. Jayson Cardano, who successfully passed the April 2025 Master Electrician Licensure Examination.

The civil engineering program also demonstrated its strength, producing 15 new Civil Engineers from the April 2025

In the realm of electronics, URS-Morong celebrated 6 passers of the April 2025 Electronics Engineering Licensure Examination and a notable 16 passers for the April 2025 Electronics Technicians Licensure Examination. A particular highlight is URS alumnus Marion Curt Loyola Villones, who clinched a spot in the Top 3 of the Electronics Technicians Licensure Examination, bringing immense honor to the alma mater.



Beyond engineering, URS graduates also excelled in other critical professional fields. The University saw 15 passers in the April 12 Certified Financial Management Specialist Assessment Examination, indicating the growing strength of its business and finance programs.

Furthermore, 10 URS-Binangonan alumni demonstrated their prowess in human resources by passing the Certified Human Resource Associate (CHRA) exam by the Human Resource Educators' Association of the Philippines (HREAP) in March 2025. Notable is URS Morong Campus being recognized as a Top Performing School in the said CHRA Assessment, a significant accolade for its human resource development programs.

Recently, four have passed the May 2025 CPALE exams for accountants.

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5.246 Graduates Celebrated in Grand Commencement Exercises

he University of Rizal System (URS) will formally graduate 5,246 students across its campuses on June 19-20, 24 and 26 when it holds its graduation at the Ynares Center in Antipolo City, Ynares Center - Rodriguez, and the URS Morong Campus. The impressive number includes a verse cohort of undergraduates, graduate school students, laboratory school completers, and senior high school graduates, all poised to contribute to various sectors of society.

The bulk of this year's graduates hails from the undergraduate programs, with a remarkable 4,832 students completing their degrees. The Morong Campus led the undergraduate contingent with 1,399 graduates, followed by Binangonan Campus with 846, and Antipolo Campus with 482. Other campuses also contributed significantly to the undergraduate tally: Angono (444), Rodriguez (454), Tanay (466), Pililla (391), Taytay (204), and Cainta (106).

The Graduate School also saw a considerable number of students reaching the pinnacle of their academic pursuits, with 289 graduates. The Morong Campus again registered the highest number of graduate school completers at 145, followed by Pililla with 64, and Rodriguez with 57. Binangonan Campus also contributed 23 graduates to the postgraduate ranks.

Adding to the celebration were 58 completers from the URS Laboratory Schools, with Morong Campus contributing 32 and Tanay Campus 26. Furthermore, the Senior High School program at the Morong Campus will proudly graduate 67 students, marking their transition to higher education or the professional world.

This massive turnout of graduates underscores URS's unwavering commitment to providing quality education and empowering individuals to become competent and responsible citizens. $\sim abc$

IPITSH Gets Bronze

To qualify for the Bronze Award, an institution must meet the following requirements: conduct a minimum of 12 IP awareness activities, hold 2 patent search training sessions, offer 1 patent drafting course, and comply with IP-related outputs and activities. ~ DARobles



The URS Research Development Unit conducted the 2025 1st Agency In-House Review (AIHR) of Completed Researches and Fullblown Extension Project Proposals on May 29 via MS Teams.
