18th RDEP Congress Winners Lauded

To recognize the efforts of URS faculty and staff in engaging in research and delivering extension services to the community, the winners in the 18th RDEP Congress will be awarded in the upcoming PRAISE at the Eulogio "Amang" Rodriguez Tanghalang Sining, URS-Morong.

The 18th University RDEP Congress was held last August 27 via Zoom platform, which featured presentations of research and extension services delivered by project implementers. It is divided into two main categories, research and extension, which are further subdivided into three overall sub-categories: descriptive research, developmental and experimental research, and best extension paper.

For the Descriptive Research category, Prof. Jose D. Elveña Jr. (Rodriguez Campus) and his study *Forecasting Solid Waste of Rodriguez, Rizal: An Input to Municipality's Solid Waste Management* won First Place, followed by Dr. Niclie L. Tiratira, Dr. Nancy T. Pascual, Dr. Marites M. Rio, and Prof. Jeremy R. Aterrado with their study *Project: Violence Against Women Psychosocial Intervention Program Study*

Dr. Wilhelmina P. Masinsin, Prof. Russell May SJ. San Diego and Prof. Bernadette G. Castalone bagged the Exemplary Behavior Award, which will be awarded on September 27, 2024, at the Eulogio Amang Rodriguez Tanghalan Sining.

Dr. Masinsin, an Associate Professor V of Morong Campus, will be awarded for championing justness and sincerity, while both Prof. San Diego, an Assistant Professor IV in Antipolo City Campus, and Prof. Castalone, also an Assistant Professor IV, in Tanay, will be awarded for exhibiting professionalism.

They were evaluated based on the quality and consistency of their behavioral performance, the impact of their behavior performance on the organization or the public, risk or temptation inherent in their line of work, the obscurity of the position in relation to the degree of performance and extraordinary norm/s they practiced, years of service and other similar circumstances or considerations. Each will receive a recognition plaque and a Php 10,000.00 financial incentive.

In addition, they will also be nominated to the Civil Service Commission Exemplary Conduct and Ethical Behavior for the Dangal ng Bayan Award. Other norms that could merit the award of Exemplary Behavior include a commitment to the public interest, political neutrality, responsiveness to the public, nationalism and patriotism, commitment to democracy, and simple living. ~RACJ

19th URS PRAISE Honors 160 Faculty, Staff 4 Admin Units Cited

One hundred sixty faculty members and five administrative units will be recognized during the 19th University of Rizal System (URS) Program on Awards and Incentives for Service Excellence (PRAISE) celebration to be held at the Eulogio "Amang" Rodriguez Tanghalang Sining (EARTS) URS Morong Campus on September 27.

A total of 115 will receive the Loyalty Award – 21 awardees for their 10th year in service, 15 for their 15th, 19 for their 20th, 39 for their 25th year, four for their 30th, 16 for their 35th, and one for her 40th year in service. The Loyalty Award incentive is granted to faculty and staff who have served the government continuously and satisfactorily for at least 10 years.

Meanwhile, 12 will be the recipients of Service Award. The Service Award is conferred to retirees under optional or compulsory retirement schemes.

Career and Self-development Incentives will also be given to 16 faculty and two staff. This award is granted in recognition of an individual who has satisfactorily completed a course or degree within or outside the campus at one's own expense and/or to faculty and staff who completed a course on scholarship or with financial assistance.

Seven programs will likely receive the Top Performer Course in Board and Other Government Examinations. The award is granted to a college/institute that offers a regulated course where graduates pass the licensure examination given by the Professional Regulation Commission (PRC) or the Technical Education Skills Development Authority (TESDA).

Awards on Best Descriptive Research, Best Developmental and Experimental Research, and Best Extension Paper will also be granted.

The High Performing Center and the Best Administrative Unit awards will likely be distributed. These awards are granted to the top organizational unit, a section, division, or office that meets the organization's performance targets and other pre-determined criteria.

Similarly, awards will be given to the Outstanding Staff, Outstanding Faculty, Exemplary Behavior, and Distinguished Administrator.



The annual PRAISE Awards is being held to identify, select, reward, and provide incentives to deserving faculty and staff. It is also given to provide incentives and interventions to motivate faculty and staff who have contributed ideas, suggestions, inventions, discoveries, superior accomplishments, and other personal efforts.

Reyna Keynotes 2024 PRAISE

Dir. Maria Leticia G. Reyna is the keynote speaker at the 2024 PRAISE. She is the Director of the Civil Service Commission (CSC) Regional Office IV. She assumed office in CSC RO IV on Sept. 1, 2022. She served as Assistant Regional Director of the CSC Regional Office 1 in San Fernando, La Union, from 2021 to 2025. She is a homegrown talent of the CSC, starting as a Personnel Analyst in 1983. She rose from the ranks, heading various Offices in the CSC Central Office, such as the Examination, Recruitment and Placement Office (ERPO), the Human Resource Relations Office (HRRO), and the Integrated Records Management Office (IRMO).

She served as a resource person on the various flagship programs of the CSC such as the Values



Orientation Workshop (VOW), Public Service Values Program (PSVP), Leadership and Management Certification Program or CPro, Supervisory Development Courses, Program to Institutionalize Meritocracy and Excellence in Human Resource Management (PRIME-HRM), and Omnibus Rules on Appointment and Other Personnel Actions (ORAOHRA), among others. She attended international conferences such as the EROPA or the Eastern Regional Organization for Public Administration held in Kuala Lumpur, Malaysia, and the Philippines, and the ACCSM or the ASEAN Conference in Civil Service Matters held in Brunei Darussalam. In 2020, she attended an online course on Business Intelligence and Data Analytics (BIDA) provided by the Australian Embassy. Recently, she also attended the Strategic Communication short course for HR Leaders.

Her educational background includes Bachelor of Science in Psychology from the University of Santo Tomas, completed academic requirements in Master in Business Administration major in Personnel Management at the Colegio de San Juan de Letran, and graduated Master in National Security Administration (MNSA) from the National Defense College of the Philippines (NDCP), and was commissioned as Lieutenant Colonel of the Philippine Marines, Armed Forces of the Philippines in 2002.

Born and raised in Manila, she is the third among the six children of Engr. Jesus L. Reyna and Mrs. Leticia Gallardo Reyna who hailed from Candon, Ilocos Sur.
