CHED's Dr. Bulauan Keynotes 20th URS PRAISE

Dr. Freddie B. Bulauan, DPA, Education Supervisor II of the Commission on Higher Education Regional Office IV (CHEDRO-IV) will be the keynote speaker as the University of Rizal System (URS) celebrates the PRAISE on October 3.

Dr. Bulauan is widely recognized as the *Epitome of Academic Vision in Higher Education* for his dedication to uplifting tertiary education in the Philippines, particularly in Region IV. A blend of pioneering spirit,



passion to serve, and sheer perseverance has defined his career, marked by significant contributions at the Commission on Higher Education (CHED).

Dr. Bulauan's long tenure at CHED has been instrumental in the academic and non-academic successes of numerous Higher Education Institutions (HEIs) in Region IV. His extensive government service experience fuels a commitment to public service and empowering others, a value he embraced early on. His leadership qualities shone brightly during his time as Education Supervisor II and Planning Officer of CHED Region IV from 2013 to 2019, where the office was recognized as the Top Performing and Outstanding Regional Office for three consecutive years (2014-2017). This competence led to promotions, first as Chief Administrative Officer (2019-2022) and currently as the Officer in Charge of the Office of the Director IV (August to December 2022 and January 1, 2024 to present).

In his commitment to elevating quality higher education, Dr. Bulauan has spearheaded key regional initiatives such as the Leveraging Innovation for Future and Transformation (LIFT) for Local Universities and Colleges (LUCs) in CALABARZON; Strengthening Management and Academic Resources for Transformation (SMART) program for emerging private HEIs; Harmonizing Employee Recognition and Opportunities (HERO) program to enhance the skills and resiliency of CHED employees; and the upcoming project, Fostering Outstanding Unique Research Activities (FOUR-A), in coordination with the Network of CALABARZON Educational Institutions (NOCEI), aiming to promote research.

Dr. Bulauan's pursuit of excellence extends to continuous learning and scholarly research. He has participated in numerous national and international capacity-building workshops, including the ASEAN Teachers Upskill with Australia University, Digital Skills Enhancement Training at Korea Open University in Seoul, South Korea, and an Advanced Short Course on Sustainable Dairy Production Systems at Massey University, New Zealand. He is also an adept researcher, with two recent co-authored studies published in the prestigious Scopus Journal such as Purposive Communication and Test of English for International Communication (TOEIC) Rating of Philippine University Students, and Climate Change and Impact in the Academic Learning Experience of Selected Students of St. Dominic College of Asia: Basis in the Proposed Policy for Online Synchronous and Asynchronous Learning Modality.

The event, held under the theme "Driving Innovation and Sustainable Impact through Research Development, and Extension Excellence," recognized outstanding contributions across various categories.

The winners in the Descriptive category are Dr. Analyn V. Inarda with her research titled Enduring Against the Odds: Phenomenologizing the Experiences of Women Academic Leaders in a VUCA Environment won First Place. Second Place is Dr. Floricel V. Ulat with her research Exploring Fractal Dimension Analysis of Academic Performance and Pre-Board Examination Results: A Case from Teacher Education Students at URS Tanay Campus. Third placers are Dr. Romeo C. Pati, Prof. Jericho M. Inarda, Prof. Fredie C. Regalario, and Dr. Florante R. Mercado with their GIS-based Bamboo Suitability Mapping and Delineation of Bamboo Clumps in Selected Areas in the Town of Rodriguez, Rizal.

Engr. Bautista is PRAISE 2025 Outstanding Faculty

In the academic landscape of 2025, one name stands out for his exceptional contributions to engineering education: Engr. Marlon A. Bautista, the recipient of the Outstanding Faculty award in this year's PRAISE.

Engr. Bautista's journey in education began in June 2003 at the University of Rizal System-Morong, where he has served as a faculty member in the College of Engineering. His expertise spans a wide array of subjects, including AC & DC Circuits, AC & DC Machines. Electromagnetics, Power Systems and Engineering Mathematics. His dedication

and leadership were quickly recognized, leading him to serve as the Electrical Engineering Program Chairperson from 2004 to 2006 and again from 2008 to 2015.

From 2015 to 2019, he took on a dual role as Dean of the College of Engineering for both the URS-Morong and URS-Antipolo City campuses. As of 2025, he holds the title of Professor IV and continues to contribute to the university's academic development as Chairman of the Journal Selection and Publication Assistance Team and the TWG on Engineering Books Evaluation.

Beyond his work at the University, Engr. Bautista has also shared his expertise as a reviewer for PowerHouse, an Engineering Review Center in 2012. Before his academic career, he gained valuable hands-on experience as a Line Electrician at Merit Stainless Steel, Inc.

Engr. Bautista is a highly educated professional, holding multiple degrees that reflect his passion for both engineering and education. He earned his Bachelor of Science in Electrical Engineering from the Technological Institute of the Philippines in 2001 and is a Registered Electrical Engineer and Registered Master Electrician, both since April 2002. He also holds a Master of Arts in Teaching Mathematics from the University of Rizal System and a Doctor of Christian Education from Antioch Theological Seminary International. In 2022, he completed a Doctor of Philosophy in Educational Management from the University of Perpetual Help System Dalta. As of 2024, he is a candidate for a Doctor of Philosophy in Engineering Education from Batangas State University.

His academic contributions extend to his published works, including co-authoring several books in 2019, such as Mathematics in the Modern World, Integral Calculus, and Electrical Circuits 1. He has also published research articles in prestigious journals. His paper on Flipped-Lecture Classroom Pedagogy in Electrical System and Illumination Design Engineering was published in the Journal of Electrical Systems in 2024. Other works, including Electrical System of URSM Science and Technology Building: An Analysis (2022) and Arithmetic Braille Calculator (2021), have been published in Neuroquantology.// abc

Dr. Namerod F. Mateo: From Valedictorian to Visionary Leader

From a valedictorian to a revered educator and administrator, Dr. Namerod F. Mateo has dedicated four decades of his life to transforming the University of Rizal System (URS) and shaping countless students' lives. His career is a testament to a deep commitment to education, research, and public service.

Dr. Mateo's journey began with a strong academic foundation, graduating cum laude with a Bachelor of Science in Forestry. He later earned a Master of Science in Forestry and a Ph.D. in Agriculture, driven by a desire to be a valuable asset to society. This passion propelled him through various leadership roles, including Campus Director, Vice President for Research Development, Extension and Production, and Dean of the Graduate School.

A pillar of the University, Dr. Mateo's tenure at URS has been marked by significant contributions that have helped elevate the institution from a college to a prominent university. As the former Vice President for Research, Development, Extension, and Production, he was a key figure in creating enabling policies for research and extension and helped establish the RDEP Training Center.
