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

STARBOOKS stands for Science and Technology Academic and Research-Based Openly Operated Kiosk Station. It is the first Philippine Science Digital Library that comprises at least 14,000 titles and 203 videos of digitized resources on science and technology. Some of its special features are its free and customizable system; a stand alone information kiosk where information is readily available even without internet connection; and a onestop science and technology information source from all over the Philippines.

Being one of the recipients of the said STARBOOKS, the University maximizes its use through its campus libraries.

# First National Conference on Digital Heritage

Representing the University of Rizal System, librarians: Cecilia G. Reyes, Aleili T. Bolire, Analyn M. Tanawan, Anna Gefreliz R. Peñaranda and Edith N. Sedutan attended the 1<sup>st</sup> National Conference on Digital Heritage with the theme: Preservation of and Access to Documentary Heritage in the Digital Age at Hotel JEN Manila, Roxas Boulevard, Pasay City last November 4-6, 2015.

Participants of the three-day conference were welcomed by Hon. Yolanda E. Jacinto, OIC, National Library of the Philippines with a keynote



address on Documentary Heritage in the Digital Age: Issues and Concerns delivered by Hon. Felipe M. De Leon, Jr., Chairman, National Commission on Culture and the Arts. In his speech, he emphasized the value of heritage as a living legacy from the past that has to be passed on to generations. He mentioned that documentary heritage is the memory of humankind but is under constant threat of disappearing forever, so the first and most urgent need is to ensure the preservation and to make this heritage accessible to as many people as possible using the most appropriate technologies.

Topics on Overview of International and National Digital Heritage Initiatives with two sessions: Spreading the Potential of Cultural and Creative Industries by assistant secretary Raymund E. Liboro of the Department of Science and Technology and The Digital Heritage of South Korea by Director General Kim Sung-II of National Library of Korea were discussed on the first day, Second day topics include National and International Framework for Digital Heritage Collection with session 1: Digital Roadmap of the Philippines by undersecretary Louis Napoleon C. Casambre of the Information and Communications Technology Office, session 2: Electronic Legal Deposit and Digitization in Japan by Vice President Hiroshi Kawamura of the Assistive Technology Development Organization (ATDO), session 3: Access to Philippine Documentary Heritage in the Digital Age, session 4: Intellectual Property Right Issues in Digital Age by Deputy Director General Allan B. Gepty, OTC, Intellectual Property Office of the Philippines, session 5: The Preservation of Digital Heritage by Mr. Martin Julius V. Perez of Department of Foreign Affair Archives and Mr. Stephen B. Alayon of Southeast Asian Fisheries Development Center. The last conference day topics were Content Development: Enriching the Digital Heritage Collection with session 1: Exploring the Digital Heritage of the Philippine Higher Education by Atty. Julito Vitriolo of the Commission on Higher Education and session 2: Access to Digital Heritage Collection: The NLB Singapore's Experience by Ms. Ngian Lek Chok, National Library Board, Singapore.

The conference closes in the afternoon with the distribution of certificates and a sumptuous lunch served.







# University Library Linkages Established

The Ateneo Initiative for Korean Studies (AIKS) along with Korean Cultural Center in the Philippines (KCC) has established linkages with University of Rizal System Library during the soft launch of the Korean Studies Portal last May 29, 2015 at Rizal Library Ateneo Loyola Heights Campus which was attended by Dr. Elvira C. Prieto and Mrs. Anna Minia Lourdes C. Martinez. The said portal aims to establish a centralized database of Korean collection from partner agencies and institutions which includes the University.

With the AIKS MOU still being finalized, the Korean Cultural Center in the Philippines (KCC), on the other hand has included the University as one of the primary beneficiaries for book donations along with the prestigious Universities in the Philippines. At present, University of Rizal System Tanay Campus has been enjoying the monthly grant of Korean related reference books.

Meanwhile, with the initiative of Dr. Elvira C. Prieto, Head of the Instructional and Library Resources Services, the University has also been a recipient of free access to on-line databases through Integrated Philippine E-Library Project of the Commission on Higher Education (CHED) and four (4) partner agencies. The said project provides a year access to eight (8) databases namely: Emerald Insight, General One File, InfoTrac Engineering, Philippine E-Journals, ProQuest, ProQuest Central, Springer Link and Science in Context. The said databases have provided millions of academic research resources which supplements the printed collection of the library.

Prieto, Head of the Instructional and Library Resource Services, selected librarians and MIS personnel attended the Integrated Philippine E-Lib Training entitled "Cascading of the IPeL Project Online Databases Subscriptions" at Rizal Technological University last September 7, 2015. The training was organized by the Commission on Higher Education and National Library of the Philippines. Participants of the said training are recipients of the Integrated Philippine eLib (IPEL) which is a collaborative project of the National Library of the Philippines, Department of Science and Technology, Department of Agriculture and University of the Philippines and Commission on Higher Education. The IPEL program provides a free year subscription to online databases and aims to provide information needed by all sectors of the society in an efficient way of delivery. During the training, the Database providers introduced and provided the participants detailed information of each database features included in the IPeL Grant.

As a result, The University Library Committee headed by Dr. Flordeliza R. Peñaranda, Vice President for Academic Affairs and Dr. Elvira C. Prieto, with the support of Dr. Medardo Bombita, Binangonan Campus Director together with the IPeL Training participants: Ms. Anna Gefreliz R. Penaranda of Tanay Campus. Mrs. Anna Minia Lourdes C. Martinez of Pililla Campus , Ms. Cherry M. Damiles, IT Staff of Morong Campus Library and Mr. Cyrus Mercado, MIS Staff of Morong Campus conducted a Re-Echo on IPEL databases to Librarians.

Library-In-Charge, Campus MIS Staff of the ten (10) URS campuses to orient them on the database features. Philippine E-Journals and Springer Link databases were introduced by Ms. Cherry M. 
The Re-echo provided the participants with the hands-on experience on how to do research using the databases and explore millions of research results that can be beneficial to the growing information demands of the academic community.

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# **Automating Library Services through KOHA**

Tanay Campus Library Website The 21<sup>st</sup> Century, library operations demand technological innovations. Library services need to be efficient and in Ranganathan's word "save the time of users". Throughout the globe, libraries use integrated library system to make library services more efficient and effective. As such, University of Rizal System adopted an open-source library system called KOHA.

KOHA originated from a team in New Zealand, and was launched in 2000. In the Philippines, KOHA was introduced through the National Library of the Philippines. They give free orientation through their Infor-

mation Technology Division to the public libraries and other institutions that wish to use KOHA as their library system. Some of the URS library personnel attended this orientation and the University started to use KOHA afterwards.



From the basic features of earlier versions, KOHA evolved and its features were enhanced. URS Campus Libraries enjoy newer versions of KOHA. At present, most campus libraries are using version 3.20 and higher. KOHA comes in two interfaces: one for library personnel or the staff interface wherein books and patrons are encoded, and an OPAC (Online Public Access Catalog) for students, faculty and public users. At present, OPAC for the URS library holdings is accessible in computer terminals of

URS Campus Libraries. The OPAC of URS Tanay Campus customized its homepage, and façade of Rizal Hall is featured. Aside from the library collections, users may access the URS Tanay Library webpage and to the subscribed databases of Integrated Philippine E-Library by the quick links found on the URS Tanay Library homepage.

# Library Services Accomplishments and Plans Presented in URS Annual Strategic Planning

She presented the accomplishment of Library Services and the planto unify the bibliographic records of campus libraries in one OPAC (open public access catalog). She highlighted the major accomplishments of the unit such as installation of DOST-STARBOOK terminals and access to subscribed online data-

bases thru Integrated Philippine eLibrary. In her presentation, she noted that Pililla Campus Library acquired the most number of books in 2015, while Cardona Campus Library has the least number of accumulated library holdings among the campus libraries. She also bragged that Pililla and Tanay Campus Libraries have their own library webpage linked to the URS website.

To add, she pleased the audience with the prepared videos showing the features of KOHA. The video showed searching books using the mobile-friendly OPAC, automated borrowing of books and other features that librarians will utilize in library operations such as cataloging and generating library reports. Dr. Prieto emphasized that URS should adopt KOHA as the integrated library system for the campus libraries so that access to information be more efficient, and to be at par with the current trends of library services.

### Trees: Their Natural History by Peter A. Thomas

URS Tanay Campus is the largest URS Campus with an area of 93 hectares. It boasts the forest reserve found inside the campus. It is fitting to acquire books that will equip the members of the campus to maintain and preserve the trees within the campus and inspire them to be one with the environment just in time when global issues on climate change arise.

One of the newly acquired books of URS Tanay Campus Main Library is *Trees: Their Natural History authored by Peter A. Thomas.* The first edition of the book was released in 1999, but the library has only the 2<sup>nd</sup> edition which was published in 2014 by Cambridge University Press.

The book has 10 chapters. Each chapter thoroughly discussed the different parts of the tree. The author compares tree parts for various types of trees. For example, the size of a cypress leaf is nearly a millimeter long

while the foxglove tree has over a meter in length and width. Color illustrations accompany the text to engage a curious reader. As responsible stewards of environment, the author discussed the pollutants and other factors that endanger and kill trees. In the final note of the Peter A. Thomas, he asks, "Are they worth it?" For a tropical country that experiences devastating floods and drought, trees are vital for a better life.
