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

On January 29, 2020, six URS Campuses, URS Tanay, Morong and Rodriguez were submitted to ISO recertification and URS Pililla, Binangonan and Antipolo Campuses for ISO Certification.

The Campus Libraries were among the units audited. The library facilities , collection, service processes and security provisions were the areas of focus during the interview. Dr Elvira C. Prieto, Head for Instructional and Library Resources Services with Mrs Aleili Bolire seats for Tanay Campus, Campus Librarians Mrs. Cecilia G. With almost a year preparation, series of workshops and continuous document enhancement., the six campuses successfully passed the ISO External Audit.



URS Library Services introduces Online Library Services

Library closed? No problem!

In support of the new normal health protocol and community quarantine, the URS Library Services Unit launched its Library Online Services: the Online Reference Request, Online Database Access Request, Online Library Clearance, and Online Library Card Application. Bonafide students, faculty, and staff can avail the services. Requests responses were sent by Document Delivery Services and Book Delivery Services.

The platform is managed by the Technical Working Group for Enhanced Information Technology and Online Lib rary Services under the supervision and monitoring of Mrs. Anna Minia Lourdes C. Martinez, the University Librarian. Requests received are forwarded and coordinated to the campus librarians who take charge of the responses. These services were created to aid the URS academic community in their research needs despite the closure of the library and suspension of face to face transactions brought about by the pandemic.

Students and faculty may send their request by filling out the forms. Reference Request are intended for scanned copies of the library's printed collection, request for electronic resources, such as e-books and e-journal articles and selected chapters of the thesis collection. Database Access is intended for researchers who wishes to access the library's digital collection databases. The Library Card Application is for the new students who wishes to avail of the online services. An automated Certification of Library Card Application will be issued to the applicants to serve as their temporary library cards.

A 24/7 Chat Service Chat with BUKNARDO is also available for other inquiries.


URS Library opens its Digital Collection

Collection development is one of the program of the University Library Services Unit which aims to deliver effective and efficient service to its clientele, whether in print and non-print modalities. Continuous acquisition of learning resources serves as the back bone of the University Library Services and has been an annual practice.

To better serve the academic community despite the closure of the libraries and suspension of access to the printed collection. The URS Library Services Unit allocated its 1.4 million 2020 budgetary allocation for the procurement of electronic books.

On the last quarter of 2020, the library has procured a total of 243 volumes of ebooks from Gale ebooks and Tritech Media, the electronic resources can be accessed by all URS Campus Libraries. Database access can be requested using the Library's Online Database Access Services.


in Research Award.

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URS Union Catalog Goes Online

The challenges posed by the Coronavirus pandemic will not prevent the Library services as a whole from presenting its latest innovative products and services that would be of considerable use and relevant to all library users.

The University of Rizal System has suspended its public on-site activities after the start of the quarantine in March 2020 due to COVID-19. The Library has never stopped its services despite the situation, and has continued to digitally serve the information needs of URS library users. The Library's highest priority is to maintain the learning needs of its patrons. Thus, online reference and support services such as Open Public Access Catalog (OPAC) and Online Library Services via social media Facebook were provided at the start of the quarantine; access to library accounts was extended and access to electronic resources was encouraged and made available to URS library users.


The online integrated library management system called Koha is used by the University of Rizal System Library Services to control and coordinate library resources, access, retrieval and circulation. Koha is an open source integrated library system, used world-wide by public, school and special libraries. In maximizing the use of this online system, not only by providing complete and updated bibliographic information of printed materials, but also by providing records of its extensive collection of digitized records and links of e-books and articles, abstracts of theses and other studies.

All of the information in URS Koha database will be available in the Online Public Access Catalog (OPAC). It is the default interface of University of Rizal System Library which provides a search engine and

supports advanced search options. Here, library users can search a library catalog virtually and mainly to locate books and other materials available in all campuses of University of Rizal System. These online resources are accessible either PC or Mobile, anytime and anywhere.

The impact of COVID-19 will be surely felt for years and with this, Library services need to be more active, resourceful, and quick to respond in providing services. The URS Library will take on new trends and will continue to support the University in meeting the demands of the new academic environment.

20 Years of Service feel appreciated by the organization.





LIBRARY AND INFORMATION SERVICES MONTH CELEBRATION




