The Tech4Ed Center in URS Morong Campus Library headed by Mrs. Cecilia G. Reyes was launched after the program.

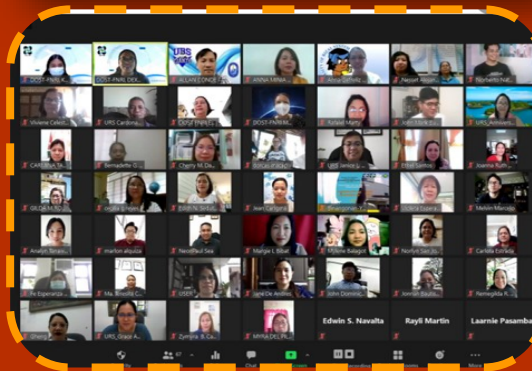

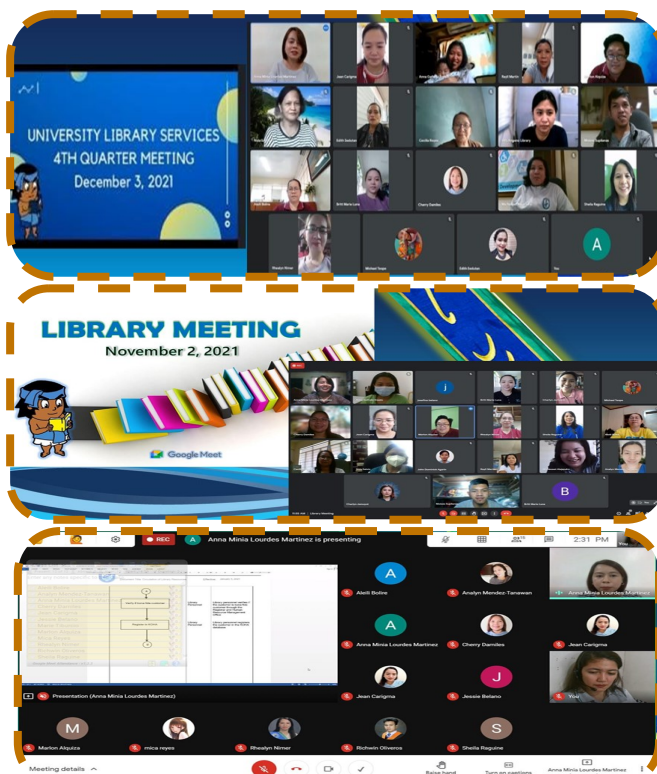


LIBRARY SERVICES TEAM CONDUCTS CONSULTATIVE MEETINGS

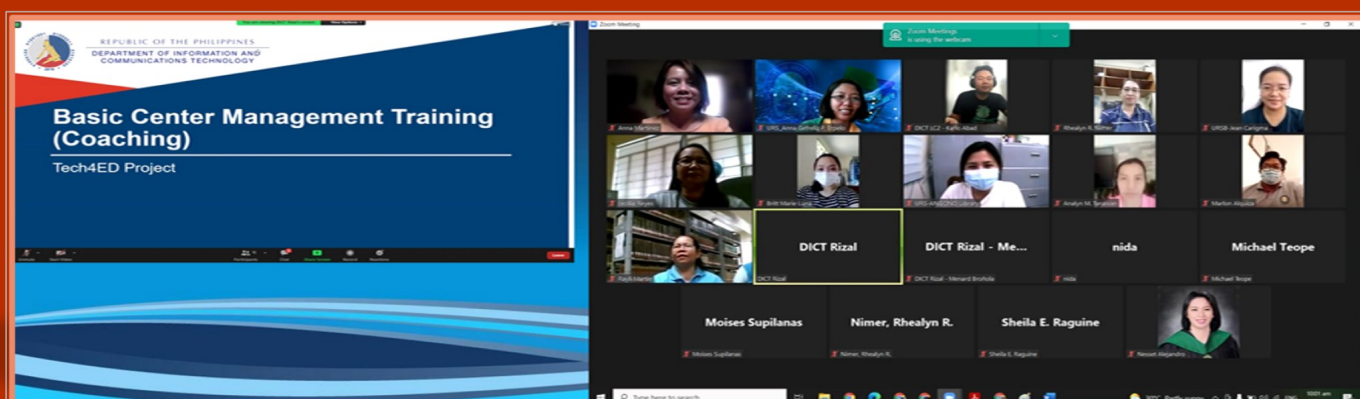
ONLINE BASIC MANAGEMENT TRAINING FOR URS LIBRARY PERSONNEL

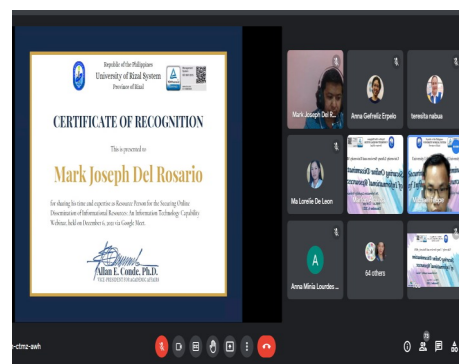

Way back July 31, 2018, University of Rizal System became a recipient of NUTRINET Adopt-a-Library (AAL) and conducted a Turn over Ceremony.

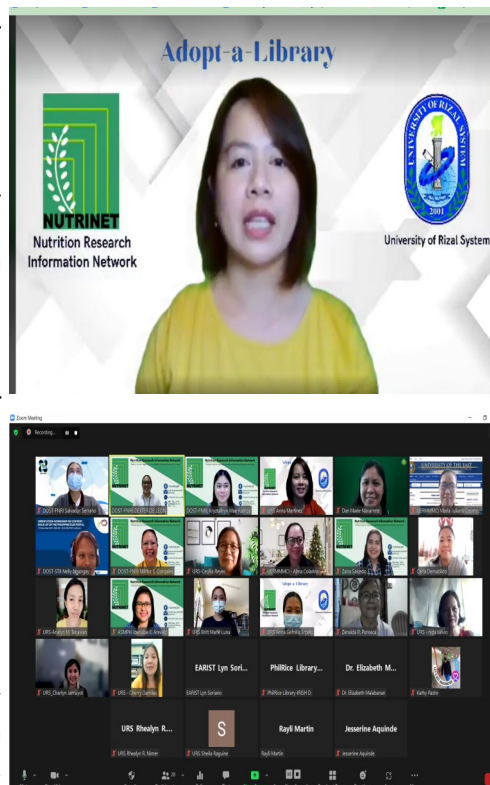

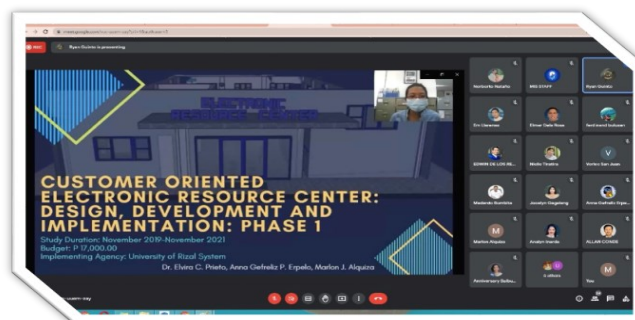
Participation of URS Tanay and Pililla in the RDEP Agency In-House Review for Completed Research and Extension

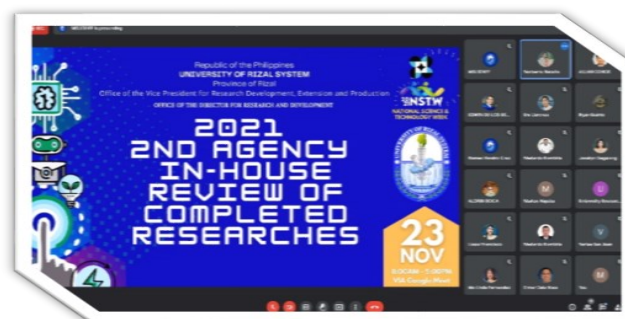
Research Development Extension and Production (RDEP) is one of the major units of University of Rizal System (URS). One of its mandates is to plan and implement approved proposals pertaining to research, extension and development in coordination with other departments and units of the University. The Library Services Unit as one the major academic support services in URS participated in these undertakings.



Phase 2 of the extension program, "Project READ: Raising Enthusiastic and Active Dwellers" was conducted on February 13, 2021, spearheaded by its tireless University Librarian/Campus Librarian of Pililla, Mrs. Anna Minia Lourdes C. Martinez. As part of the program, learning kit and reading materials were distributed. It aims to increase the love of reading of young learners and likewise improve its level comprehension. Phase 2 of the program was first initiated on November 7, 2020 through MOA signing with the Sangguniang Kabataan of Quisao, Chair Mr. Chino Chan as partner agency.



Similarly, completed research entitled "Customer Oriented Electronic Resource Center: Design, Development and Implementation: Phase 1" by Dr. Elvira C. Prieto, Mr. Marlon J. Alquiza and Mrs. Anna Gefreliz P. Erpelo of Tanay Campus was presented online on November 23, 2021 during the RDEP Congress. The study aims to determine the preferred services, equipment and fixtures to be available in the Electronic Resource Center (ERC) based on clientele type. The proponents were able to present the results and the proposed ERC Design in 3D.

On the last quarter of 2021, the library has procured a total of 918 volumes. The distribution is reflected in the table:



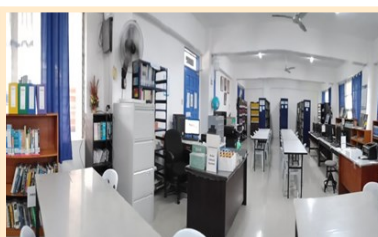

The library plays an important and unique role in an academic community. It is considered the heart of any learning institution, this is the reason why, LIBRARY SERVICES are part of the accreditation of programs by the AACCUP or the Accrediting Agency of Charter Colleges and Universities of the Philippines. There are seven indicators being evaluated by the AACCUP in the Library to pass

the said Accreditation, these are 1) Administration, 2) Library Personnel, 3) Collection Development, Organization and Preservation, 4) Services and Utilization, 5) Physical Set-Up and Facilities, 6) Financial Support, and 7) Linkages. There are requirements of each area that need to be met by the URS to pass the Accreditation.

Fortunately, the Library services meet all the requirements set by the AACCUP. The URS pursuit to academic excellence, ACCREDITATION is now being considered as a regular activity of the university under the Curriculum and Instruction department. Last year 2021, 8 campuses underwent AACCUP Accreditation in different programs and level, to wit :

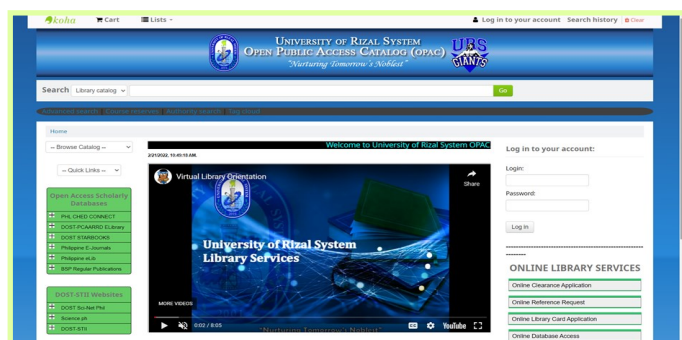
The campus library personnel of the ten (10) campuses played a vital role in the success of the preparation of mandatory documents and other pertinent records to be uploaded in their respective drive for easier access and retrieval. The campus librarians and the University Librarian, Ms. Anna Minia Lourdes C. Martinez spearheaded the sharing and reviewing of library procedures and documents to be prepared and coded as well.

Among the ten (10) campuses, Cardona, Cainta, Angono and Taytay were virtually audited by TUV-R External Auditors for Certification on April 30, 2021, meanwhile, Tanay, Morong, Rodriguez, Pililla Binangonan and Antipolo were also subjected to recertification.

With the success of the audit, all URS Campuses are now ISO CERTIFIED!

An Engaging OPAC for URS Library Services: Updates on Integrated Library System

The new learning environment of the University pushed the library services to be more engaged in online services with the students, faculty members, students, and other stakeholders of University of Rizal System. The Online Public Access Catalog (OPAC) has become vital in the delivery of virtual library services. The OPAC is not only a portal for searching available library resources in the campus libraries. With the help of the very able members of the Technical Working Committee on Enhancement of Information Technology and Online Services, the OPAC interface was enhanced to include links to the various online library requests forms, links to other online resources, and a link to the University Library Services Facebook Page. Library customers can click the type of online library service they would like to avail of on the right

navigation pane of the OPAC. Aside from the printed library resources, catalog records with links to online resources from subscribed e-books from Tritech Digital Media and Gale, selected e-books from the Directory of Open Access Books, e-journals from Directory of Open Access Journals, some titles of the Philippine Recommends series and other academic and scholarly open-access resources are now searchable in the OPAC. They can also click Buknardo, our virtual library assistant to chat with their library inquiries. It also features a virtual library orientation of the University Library Services. It is played automatically once the OPAC loads on the screen.

The functionality of the staff interface allows the library personnel to continue work remotely. Library personnel can update the library holdings and patron records. Patron records were also updated containing the books currently checked out in their account. Library personnel can also check in real-time the responses from the online library service requests. This allows the unit to be prompt with the delivery of library services in the online modality. With high hopes, the Online Public Access Catalog of the University of Rizal System would be more engaging to faculty, students, and stakeholders of the University.
