URS Librarians Participate in PLAI Congress 2024; University Librarian Presents Research






URS Library Services Subjected to Accreditation and CHED-COPC Visit

Harnessing Library Utilization Data: Empowering Library


The utilization statistics of a library provide valuable insights into how resources, services, and facilities are accessed and used by patrons. These figures are vital for assessing service effectiveness, identifying areas for improvement, and supporting data-driven decision-making.

At the University of Rizal System, the 2024 library utilization statistics reveal a significant level of engagement. A total of 229,871 onsite users across the ten URS campuses accessed library services. This strong turnout underscores the continuing importance of physical library spaces as hubs of academic activity and student support.

It is important to note that the number of library users per campus generally reflects the number of enrol-lees. Larger campuses tend to record higher library usage due to their bigger student population. For instance, Morong Campus, being the most populous campus, registered the highest number of library users at 90,971, far surpassing the other campuses. This trend demonstrates the close relationship between enrollment size and library utilization rates.

Beyond physical use, URS Library Services have expanded accessibility through digital platforms. In 2024, online library resources, such as e-books, academic databases, journals, and research tools, were available anytime and anywhere. This ensures flexibility and convenience, supporting both students and faculty whether on campus or studying remotely.

The interpretation of these figures goes beyond numbers, it reflects user behavior, preferences, and evolving needs. For librarians and administrators, such data guides the monitoring of trends, enhancement of collections, and improvement of outreach strategies, ensuring that services remain responsive, inclusive, and efficient.



URS Conducts Annual Strategic Planning and Budgeting to Align Goals and Resources

As part of the certification requirements, an internal audit was conducted beforehand to ensure the university's readiness for the external evaluation by **TÜV Rheinland**, the accredited agency responsible for granting URS its international certification. This initiative underscores the university's commitment to fostering a culture of accountability and excellence, marking a significant step in evaluating and enhancing its internal processes.

The campus libraries were among the units audited, with a focus on facilities, services, resources, operations, security, and user satisfaction. Representing the campus libraries during the audit were

These audits play a crucial role in ensuring that library services, facilities, and management systems align with global best practices. They also help identify areas for improvement and enhance efficiency in library administration, particularly in acquisition, information organization, and research support.

Achieving ISO recertification strengthens the university's reputation and competitiveness in international education. It also ensures that quality standards are continually improved and maintained, ultimately benefiting stakeholders through the implementation of best practices.



Resource Acquisition, Integration of OER and Library Improvements 2024

In response to the evolving needs of students and researchers, libraries continue to enhance their resources and facilities. This year, the University Library is making significant strides in resource acquisition and the integration of Open Educational Resources (OER), ensuring broader access to cost-effective and flexible learning materials.

To strengthen academic support, the library has added 614 new print titles, totaling 1,030 volumes, alongside 145 new e-book titles, expanding digital accessibility for students and faculty. Further promoting open access to knowledge, 926 Open Educational Resources from the Directory of Open Access Books (DOAB) have been integrated into the university's online Integrated Library System, providing valuable academic materials free of charge. Library improvements also focus on creating a more comfortable and technology-driven learning environment. New air conditioning systems have been installed at both the Pililla and Morong Campus libraries, enhancing the overall user experience. Additionally, upgrades such as automated systems, interactive learning spaces, and expanded digital collections are fostering a more efficient, inclusive, and student-centered library.

Through these continuous advancements, the university remains committed to enriching research, learning, and knowledge-sharing. By integrating OER, expanding collections, and upgrading facilities, the library strengthens its role as a vital academic hub, supporting a dynamic and accessible educational experience for all.

Mrs. Anna Gefreliz P. Erpelo facilitated the library instruction for library resources & APA citation in URS Tanay Campus Electronic Resource Center held on March 08, 2024. Participated in by students from the College of Agriculture. This Session focused on making the most of the university library's resources and

appropriately using the APA citation format Students learned how to properly and morally credit their sources in accordance with the most recent APA criteria and were also introduced to the resources required to access print and electronic references.

Bibliographic Citation

way to generate accurate citations for your research papers, theses, and projects.

The library currently offers access to Zotero, a powerful yet easy-to-use citation tool that formats citations automatically in several styles, including APA, MLA, Chicago, and others. Zotero saves time by gathering, organizing, and formatting references at the touch of a button.

For students and faculty who need extra help, the library further provides Library Instruction on Bibliographic Citation. The service offers individualized instruction on how to properly use

Zotero and comprehend the significance of effective citation in academic writing.

Alt-text and Assistive Technology Integration: Making It Easier for All. In its continued quest to make accessibility even better for everyone, the URS Library has upgraded its Online Public Access Catalog (OPAC) by adding Alt-text (alternative text) to the catalog's icons. Alt-text describes non-text elements like images and icons in textual form, which makes the OPAC more accessible to print disabled users.

The recently upgraded OPAC can be accessed online at http://opac.urs.edu.ph, where patrons can experience the Alttext option by merely enabling the assistive technologies on their devices.

The addition of Alt-text is just one of the many steps the URS Library Services is taking to ensure that all users, regardless of their abilities, have an equal opportunity to access and utilize library resources. This initiative underscores the university's dedication to creating an accessible and inclusive learning environment, ensuring that all students, regardless of their needs, can fully engage with the resources available to them. This enhancement reflects the URS Library Services' onaoina commitment to inclusivity and equal access to information for all faculty, staff and students.
